# Create Your Own Festival Map

Get creative and make your own Irvine Global Village Festival map. From your favorite restaurant to Kids Village to the singers and dancers on the big stage, you can lay out what your ideal festival would look like.

## ***Supplies needed:***

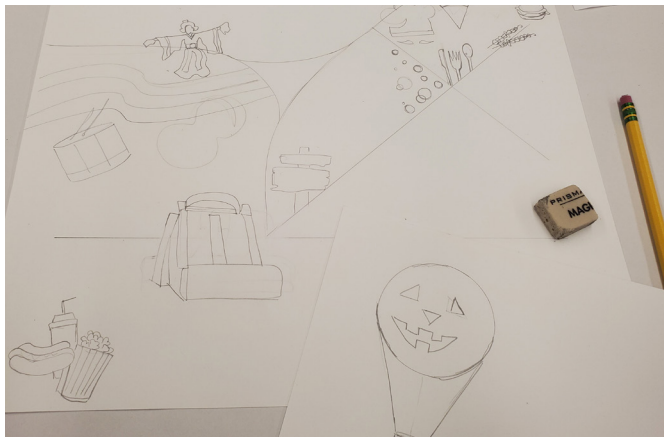
- Ruler
- Pencil
- Eraser
- **White heavy stock paper**  
(approximately 11"x14")  
Example: watercolor, bristol, cardstock, or poster paper
- **Colored Sharpies or markers**
- **Colored pencils**
- **Scissors**
- **Colored construction paper**  
(any colors)
- **Cardboard pieces**
- **Elmer's glue or glue stick**
- **Optional:** Watercolor paints, oil pastels, patterned or scrapbook paper, washi tape, hot glue gun, past Irvine Global Village Festival maps for references

## Step 1



- On heavy stock paper, use a pencil to lightly sketch your festival outline. Draw lines to divide the map into sections to indicate the different festival areas.
- Draw pictures representing festival areas such as Kids Zone, Family Terrace, or Food Court directly onto your paper (map) or on a separate piece of paper to glue on top later.

## Step 2



- Using colored construction paper, trace map sections and cut out. Glue to the map and draw over it using markers and colored pencils.
- You can also color in the sections using colored pencils or markers to create different textures.
- Draw and color in the festival images that represent each map section. Ideas: food, games, rides, dancers, musical instruments, etc.
- Cut out and glue onto your map.



## Step 3



- For a 3D effect, cut small pieces of cardboard and glue on the back of a drawing, stacking the cardboard pieces if needed.
- Glue the cardboard directly onto your map; the images should be sticking out to create a 3D effect.
- You can do this with signs for your festival as well.

## Step 4



- Use shapes for banner signs.
- Make each sign unique by using different colors and different fonts.
- Outlining in different thicknesses using a Sharpie or marker can make objects stand out.
- Don't forget to add a restroom, first aid, entrance, and other areas on your map.
